




Dante's cantos reimagined in Jamaica

"Halfway tree. The journey of our life found me / there at midnight in a ramshackle state." So begins Lorna Goodison's astonishing new adaption of "The Inferno" by Dante Alighieri, a poet she once described as "uncompromising as an Old Testament prophet, stern as a Rastafarian elder."

For the last two decades, Goodison has reimagined Dante's cantos, setting the original poem in her native Jamaica and employing Jamaican expressions and sayings. In doing so, she has done for Caribbean vernacular what Dante did for his Italian language in the fourteenth century—endow it with an entirely new vocal music and power. In recreating the journey through the "unpaved and rocky road" of Dante's Hell for a contemporary audience, Goodison has given us a dazzling and profound new narrative of spiritual yearning for our era.

DANTE ALIGHIERI was born in 1265 in Florence and is considered Italy's greatest poet.

LORNA GOODISON is the author of 15 books of poetry, most recently *Mother Muse* which was shortlisted for The Derek Walcott Prize for Poetry. Born in Jamaica, Goodison has taught at the University of Toronto and the University of Michigan, and now lives in Halfmoon Bay, British Columbia. Goodison was Jamaica's Poet Laureate from 2017 to 2020 and was the recipient of The Queen's Gold Medal for Poetry in 2019.



Quietly, Loving Everyone, Curtis McRae's debut collection of stories, assembles a meditative and often profound cycle of portraits pulled from everyday Canadian life. A young boy raises James Dean from the dead, only to find out the cult icon is not the playmate he'd hoped for. A university student riddled with ulcers silently spirals after being diagnosed with an autoimmune disease. A young girl takes a road trip with her older sister to Cape Cod, and years later reconstructs the tragic circumstances behind what she remembers. A couple goes on a date at an old porn theatre that is the last remaining vestige of a neighbourhood that has moved on. McRae plays witness to these characters at those crucial beginnings or ends of relationships, with lovers, friends, family, and most importantly themselves.


An unsparing confessional dive into the unseen costs of development

This Rare Earth is a graphic account of twenty-five years working for some of the largest mining and engineering companies in the world. Much of this work was conducted in conflict zones where Gilmer supervised the construction of dams, mine tailings structures, and oil and gas facilities. He brings to life the daily realities of those caught in the crossfire of progress—miners, villagers, and local leaders who grapple with the promises and perils of development.

Gilmer describes nerve-wracking situations dealing with corrupt authorities, natural disasters, and project failure. He writes about his time in Northern Angola at the end of a bloody civil war, discusses building a gold mine in cartel territory in Colombia, and looking for water in the wind-swept pampa of southern Argentina.

He writes from a place rarely heard from in the debate: an industry linked not only to the environmental challenges we face as a species, but to the very systems our lives, and economy, depend on.

JEREMY THOMAS GILMER has been longlisted for the CBC Canada Writes Short Story Prize, won the inaugural Short Story Day Africa Flash Fiction Prize, and was selected as the writer-in-residence at the KiRA residency in 2018. He grew up in Nigeria, Northern Ireland, and Canada. He lives in Saint John, New Brunswick.

Surprising and intricately orchestrated poems

"I did not know there was a sound / silence made as it laps at the body's shore," observes Bridget Huh in her debut collection, Fugue Body—a book in which the body becomes a site of inquiry: a compositional space of melody, counterpoint, and theme. In surprising and intricately orchestrated poems that range from the lyric to the essayistic, Huh meditates on linguistic and racial identity, considers generational differences in an immigrant context, and recounts the life of the Finnish composer Jean Sibelius. In doing so, she renders the music of a restless, relentless mind with remarkable candour and beauty. "I want all the violins to shimmer," writes Huh, "I want them to stand for impermanence."

BRIDGET HUH is an MFA candidate in poetry at Cornell University. She holds a BA from Concordia University, where she received the Gabriel Safdie Award in Creative Writing. Her poetry and criticism have appeared in *Arc Poetry Magazine*, *PRISM International*, *The Ex-Puritan* and *Canthius*. Huh grew up in Toronto and is the winner of the 2023 Vallum Poetry Award.



The poems in Alice Turski's ravenous and playful *Stolen Plums* explore the ways we consume and are consumed by those we love and the histories they embody. Poignantly navigating uncertainties of self, country, and family, Turski contemplates the precarities of immigration, belonging, matrilineage, and marriage in unsparing language that straddles the border between ode and elegy. She captures not only a world "ready to eat whatever / you can bear abandoning," but also the desire animating "tines of light that make [a] tense face beautiful." *Stolen Plums* is a singular and singularly voracious debut.

ALICE TURSKI grew up in Houston, Texas. She studied biology and medicine at Washington University in St. Louis and New York University before receiving her MFA from Cornell University. Her poems have appeared in *The Iowa Review*, *Verse Daily*, *Copper Nickel*, *The Cimarron Review*, *PRISM International*, and other journals. She lives in Vancouver, British Columbia.


Fish Piss was a calling card to a true bohemian community

Called Canada's most influential zine, *Fish Piss* ran for 11 issues, from 1996 to 2006. It began as a bilingual mash-up of the Montreal anglophone spoken word scene and the comics scene. Edited by Montrealer Louis Rastelli, and rooted in the DIY punk ethos, *Fish Piss* was a contact zone of literary material, comics, essays, interviews, politics, and music. Eventually the publication went from a scrappy photocopied zine to a publication with advertising and worldwide distribution. By the time it folded, *Fish Piss* was a calling card to a true bohemian community, perhaps the last of its kind.

Some of *Fish Piss*'s early contributors who went on to illustrious careers include Kid Koala, Genevieve Castrée, Catherine Kidd, Heather O'Neill, and Jonathan Goldstein. Brown, who lived in Montreal during this period, offers an insider's reflection on the cultural significance of the zine and its lasting legacy. He explores the history of various bohemian communities and *Fish Piss*'s singular role in that history.

ANDY BROWN founded Conundrum Press in Montreal in 1996. He is the author of *The Mole Chronicles* and co-edited *You and Your Bright Ideas: New Montreal Writing*. He was a co-founder of Expozine, Canada's largest small press fair. He currently lives in Wolfville, Nova Scotia.



Excitement resonated throughout Montreal and across Quebec in the wake of the Quiet Revolution and in the immediate aftermath of Expo 67. Yet at the time, the city was also a hub of discordant politics, many of which were about the promises of various types of leftism and their intersection with nationalism. Cultural workers participated actively in these debates

In telling the story of Jazz Libre, *Soundtrack to the Revolution* reveals the meaningful role that the art of spontaneity played in the turbulent 1960s and 1970s. It traces the path taken by Jazz Libre—a collective of improvisers who embraced free jazz to help legitimize the efforts of the Quebec left to situate its nationalist aspirations within global anti-imperialist and anti-capitalist movements. Their many initiatives (concert forums aimed at students and workers, a self-governing arts summer camp, a socialist commune in the Eastern Townships as well as an experimental cultural centre in Old Montreal) were all oriented toward the convergence of protest movements shaking Quebec.

ERIC FILLION is director of the International Institute for Critical Studies in Improvisation and assistant professor at the School of Languages and Literatures at the University of Guelph. He co-edited *Statesman of the Piano: Jazz, Race, and History in the Life of Lou Hooper.*



Founded in 2010, the Montreal International Poetry Prize has established itself as a major event in contemporary poetry. The 2024 anthology again listens for that vocal register capable of imagining justice and confessing desolation in tones at once private and resonant, the register that is the lyric. In forms recognizable and new, these poems speak their commentary and comment on their speech, plunging us into the sounds and self-reflections that distinguish poetic self-knowing as one of the oldest and highest arts.

A dedicated team of professors and students at McGill University recruited the distinguished international jury to sift the entries to the 2024 competition, and from those thousands, these sixty-five poems were chosen for their meaning to the average reader. A.E. Stallings, Oxford Professor of Poetry, then judged the finalists, selecting the one poem – included here – to take the \$20,000 prize. From around the world, these lyrics voice a reality that you will recognize as strangely yours.
